Dear Parent/Guardian,

We welcome your child/ward back to the new school term!

The start of a new term brings a mix of anticipation and resolve, with fresh perspectives and possibilities ahead. 2. **School Structures and Programmes**

2.1 Co-Curricular Activity (CCA) Stand-Down

2.2 Blended Learning

The Term 3 Home Based Learning (HBL) days and dates are as follow:

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- On HBL Days, Secondary 1 to 3 students will follow the school's timetable for the day, including the Recess and Lunch periods which will serve as breaks for the students.
- Secondary 4 & 5 students will attend school as usual from Term 3 onwards with no HBL arrangements. They will need to report for their National Oral Examinations in

English Language and Mother Tongue Languages from 15 July to 17 July 2025. Students should refer to their entry proof for their specific examination dates and reporting times.

- 3.3 Early Dismissal of Students for National Listening Comprehension Examination
The **GCE O-Level MT / MTB Languages Listening Comprehension Examination** will take place on **8 July 2025** in the afternoon via e-broadcast. In view of this national examination, all Secondary 1 to 3 students will be dismissed at **1.00 pm**.

The **GCE N-Level English and Mother Tongue Languages Listening Comprehension Examinations** will take place in the afternoons of 16 September and 17 September 2025 via e-broadcast. In view of this national examination, all Secondary 1 to 3 students will be dismissed at **1.00 pm**.

4. Student Well-Being and Pupil Management Matters

- 4.1 Recess and Lunch Break schedule in Term 3 & 4
We would like to share with you our school's recess and lunch break schedule, which has been thoughtfully planned to support your child/ward's well-being and optimise their learning experience.

On Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays, when students have longer school days, they are provided with two designated breaks: a recess and a lunch break. This arrangement aligns with research findings, which emphasises that regular breaks during the school day are essential for adolescents' cognitive function, social development, and physical well-being. Studies have shown that well-timed breaks help maintain students' attention spans and improve their academic performance.

On Wednesdays (late start day) and Fridays, which are shorter school days, students have one recess break. As these days have fewer contact hours, one break is sufficient to maintain students' engagement and well-being while ensuring efficient use of curriculum time.

This break schedule has been implemented based on best practices in student wellness and educational research. We encourage parents/guardians to support this routine by ensuring your child/ward has nutritious meals to sustain them throughout the school day.

- 4.2 Usage of Mobile Phone
For effective teaching and learning to take place, we need to set boundaries for our students. Mobile phones may be used only during these timings:

- Mobile phones may be used only before 7.30 am and
- after the last period of curriculum time (3.00 pm on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays, 2.30 pm on Wednesdays and 12.30 pm on Fridays).

We would like to emphasise that students are not allowed to use their mobile phones during recess. Students are to store their phones in their personal lockers before 7.30 am and to retrieve it after the last period of curriculum time (3.00 pm on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays, 2.30 pm on Wednesdays and 12.30 pm on Fridays). During curriculum time, mobile phones are to always be out of sight. This includes during the change-over of lessons and while students are walking along the corridor.

Phone use is also prohibited during CCA and Structured Consultation Time.

If the mobile device policy is violated, the mobile phone will be confiscated immediately and kept under lock and key in the General Office. For the first and second offence (for the year), the phone will be confiscated up till 5.00 pm on that day. For the third offence and above (for the year), the phone will be confiscated and kept under lock and key in the General Office every day at 7.30 am till 5.00 pm for five days.

4.3 Punctuality

Students who are late for school for two or more occasions are required to serve detention after school on the same day, during which, they will engage in self-study, reading and/or Corrective Work Order. All students required to serve detention must do so on the actual date of offence regardless of involvement in competitions, tuition classes, remedial sessions and CCAs. Recalcitrant students who do not respond positively to the school's intervention measures may face other disciplinary actions such as in-school/home suspension or caning (for boys).

The following reminders were previously communicated in our past termly letters. We are reiterating these important points for your attention.

4.4 iPads

iPads may be used during curriculum time for learning purposes. During classroom lessons where iPads are not required for learning, they should be put away and not accessed. Students should follow teacher's instructions on "screens up" and "screens down". If iPads are used inappropriately during curriculum time, disciplinary actions will be meted out accordingly.

4.5 CCA T-shirt

Students are encouraged to wear their approved CCA T-shirts on Tuesdays with school pants/skorts if they have no PE lessons. Students who have PE on that day will change into their CCA T-shirts during recess, lunch break or after 3.00 pm.

Students are to wear full school uniform/school Polo-T on days with internal and national examinations.

4.6 Using Students' Images/ Recordings for Publications

The school will be using students' images and/or recordings for school publications. Should parents/guardians have any concerns, kindly inform the school through your child/ward's Character Coaches.

4.7 Maintaining Good Behaviour at All Times

The school places great emphasis on inculcating good habits in our students, such as the prudent use of time. As such, we would like to emphasise that students are not to loiter and misbehave in the neighbourhood after school. We urge you to strongly advise your child/ward to behave appropriately at all times especially while he/she is in school uniform.

4.8 Attire and Grooming

The school's grooming and attire policy is aimed at educating Hougeans to look smart and presentable at all times. Having proper attire and grooming is an outward expression of students' readiness to learn. It is also important as it signifies the pride that students

have for themselves and the school. To achieve the above intent, grooming and attire checks are carried out periodically throughout the year.

If the students' grooming and attire is not appropriate, a grace period of 2 days will be given for rectification with a follow-up check. Students who fail the follow-up check will be sent home to have the grooming issue/s rectified, and parents/guardians will be informed.

Students are to wear the full school uniform with school tie on Mondays when they report to school. On days where there are PE lessons, students are required to report to school in their school shirt/blouse, Polo t-shirt, PE T-shirt or CCA T-shirt with pants/skorts (not allowed to report to school in PE shorts). If they wish to, students can choose to wear their PE shorts under their pants/skorts instead. They are allowed to wear PE attire only during PE lessons.

4.9 Advisory on Vaping

E-vaporisers are illegal in Singapore. Under the Tobacco (Control of Advertisements and Sale) Act, the possession, use or purchase of e-vaporisers carries a maximum fine of \$2,000. It is also an offence to import, distribute, sell, or offer for sale e-vaporisers and their components. Any person convicted of such offences is liable to a fine of up to \$10,000, or imprisonment of up to six months or both for the first offence, and a fine of up to \$20,000, or imprisonment of up to 12 months or both for the second or subsequent offence. All prohibited tobacco items will be seized and confiscated.

MOE takes a firm stand against vaping. Vaping is categorised as a serious offence. When students are caught using or in possession of e-vaporisers, the prohibited product will be confiscated, and their parents/guardians will be informed. Schools will report the offender to Health Sciences Authority (HSA) and manage vaping-related offences through existing disciplinary frameworks. These include taking school-based disciplinary actions, such as suspension or caning (for boys). Students caught vaping will also be placed on cessation support programmes where counsellors will guide them through their cessation journey to effect long-term behavioural change.

Parents/guardians have an important part to play in your child/ward's education. There are resources and relevant information that parents/guardians can access on Parent Hub. Parents/guardians are encouraged to have a serious conversation with your child/ward about vaping to prevent it from becoming a life-long habit. In line with the Ministry of Education's Five-Day Work Week, parents/guardians are encouraged to respect teachers' personal time and space. Teachers can be contacted during weekdays between 7.30 am and 6.00 pm. They are not expected to respond to parents'/students' queries during weekends or after 6.00 pm on weekdays except for emergencies. We seek your understanding and support on this.
